

Members of the Oxford Round Table cordially invite you to attend the Oxford Round Table for college and university presidents which will be held at St. Antony's College, Oxford University, Oxford, England from July 8 through July 13, 2001.

This invitation is extended to you to join a small group of college and university leaders who will be participants in the Oxford Round Table in 2001. Former members of Round Tables include ministers of education, governors from various states in the United States, members of parliaments in the United Kingdom and other countries, chief executive officers of international corporations, academicians, and university leaders from institutions throughout the world. All participants are invited by virtue of their current leadership positions and for their potential to make significant contributions to the Round Table discussions. Round Table membership is limited to only forty (40) persons in order to facilitate productive informal dialogue both during Round Table sessions and at other scheduled events.

In August 1989, the Oxford Round Table first convened to consider issues in contemporary educational policy in the United States, the United Kingdom and other selected countries. The membership of the initial meeting was limited to Ministers of Education from several nations, corporate executives and a few governors from the United States. The meeting was of such success that subsequent sessions were held throughout the decade of the 90's. Based on these experiences and the associated initiatives, the membership of the Round Table considered further meetings to be highly desirable to examine relevant issues in higher education.

The Round Table is a unique forum, not a conference in the conventional sense, but rather an opportunity to discuss important policy questions over a five-day period in a collegial, "think-tank" atmosphere. Selected papers presented as part of the discussion are published and distributed to policymakers and academic libraries around the world. Previous Round Tables have produced several books including *Reforming Education in a Changing World: International Perspectives*, *The Faces of Education: A World View* and *Residential Colleges: Reforming American Higher Education*. The Round Table publications traditionally convey varied approaches for improving policies of institutions and organizations throughout the world.

The Round Table, 2001, will concentrate on higher education reforms, policy, and leadership issues that will impact institutions in the first decade of the new millennium. Within the scope of this broad agenda special attention will be given to on the following themes:

1. Access to higher education: role of institutional government.
2. Financial challenges: costs, tuition and fees.
3. Rankings and ratings: assessment of quality and effectiveness.
4. Technology and distance learning: opportunities and dilemmas.

The Round Table was sponsored in previous years by The Boeing Company, Apple Computer Company, and The British Council; corporate sponsorship is anticipated again this year. The Round Table is staffed by prominent scholars, who will provide perspectives and serve in assisting members in their deliberations.

Cost of attendance, including room and meals, is borne by the invitee or the invitee's institution or organization. The total cost for each participant is \$2795 (U.S. Dollars) plus airfare. Guests of participants are welcome, however there is an additional charge for lodging, meals, and sightseeing.

Participants will be accommodated at St. Antony's College, Oxford University, throughout the meeting. Breakfast, lunch and dinner will be taken in the hall at the College. Participants can become members of the Bodleian Library of Oxford University and utilize that grand facility throughout the week. It is intended that some time will be allocated for sightseeing and recreational interests by participants and their guests. Tours of the Oxford Colleges and Blenheim Palace will be conducted as part of the Round Table activities. Further time will be allocated for walking the rural Cotswolds, punting on the Isis or other excursions along the footpaths beside the river Cherwell in the nearby countryside.
